Hospitality has been a pillar value of monastics since the beginnings of monasticism and today is certainly no exception for us as Benedictines. It is true that the prefix of monasticism is *mono*, meaning one, alone or single, and yet St. Benedict, the father of Western monasticism, says that a monastery is never without guests. Even his predecessors, the Desert Fathers and Mothers who had gone into the desert to seek God, held hospitality in such high esteem that it trumped the daily rules. Why? Because, as St. Benedict begins chapter 53 of his Holy Rule, "All guests who present themselves are to be welcomed as Christ, for he himself will say: I was a stranger and you welcomed me." So we try to welcome guests as Christ would welcome them, all the while welcoming Christ in the guests who come to us. To better attend to Christ's commission we have made some changes in our lives to keep up with the times.

In the last several years we have been right-sizing and upgrading our building to better and more efficiently accommodate ourselves and our guests. After converting the chapel portion of the original building into two stories to

create Sisters' bedrooms upstairs, our second phase focused on converting smaller bedrooms into larger guest rooms with private baths. The original four guest rooms are scheduled for upgrades this year, so soon we will have thirteen fully functioning guest accommodations. We easily fill those rooms on weekends when we host groups such as quilters, scrapbookers, retreatants, etc., or an assortment of guests for different occasions. The weeks (and sometimes days) are rare when we have no guests.

The 1967 original heating system has proven inadequate and inefficient, and we never had the equipment to cool the building universally. According to a recent newspaper article, North Dakota is just behind Alaska now in rising temperatures, but those of us who have lived here for a long time know that summers can be as brutally hot as other parts of the country. So this summer we have begun the installation of a new hybrid system that would heat and cool with exceptionally high efficiency as well as save us money in the long run. Soon our guest will have as comfortable settings as we enjoy in our renovated portion.

Housing guests has always been a value for us, but our opportunities have taken new shape. With fewer able Sisters here at the monastery to help with the service of guests in housekeeping and meals, we shifted from housing and presenting to larger groups to hosting smaller ones or individual guests. With the rapidly rising population, increase in traffic, and cultural shifts in western North Dakota, the beauty and quiet of our Monastery and grounds help people slow down, stroll along the
